- Stay out a little later if you want to avoid the crowds – leave the city after 1am if you can.

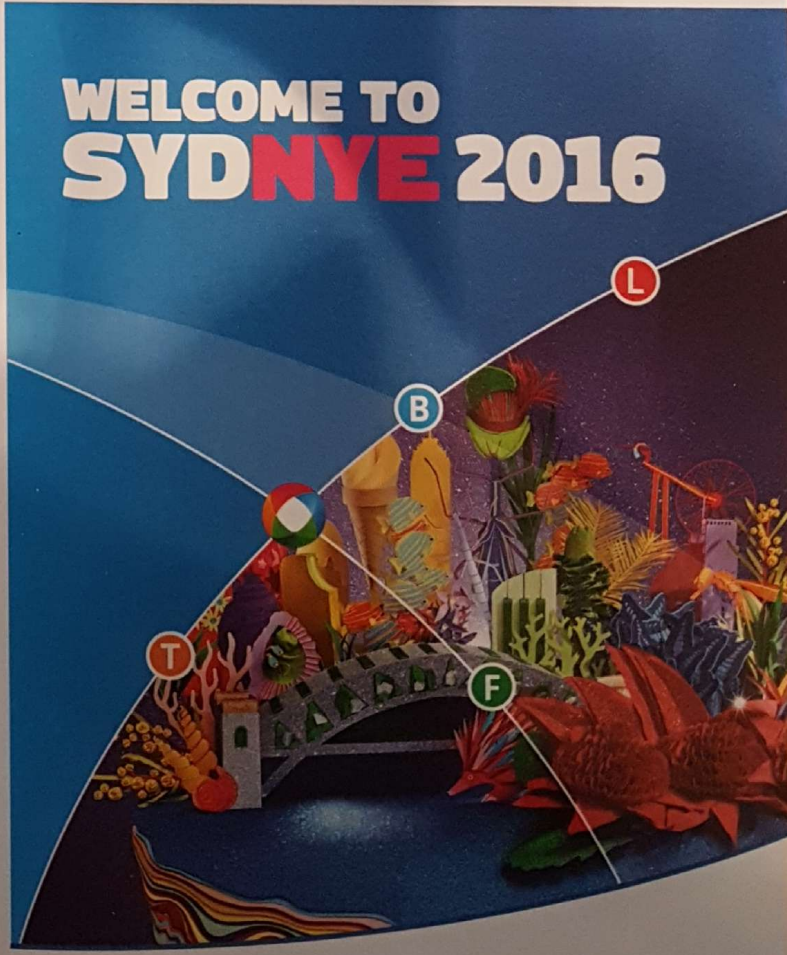

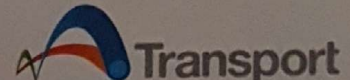

A quick guide to public transport on the night.

- T Train**
 - Some train stations will have different entry and exit points.
 - Access to Wynyard Station is via Wynyard Walk and Hunter St only.
 - Circular Quay Station will be closed from 6pm to 1am.
 - Citybound trains will not drop off passengers at Milsons Point between 6pm and midnight.
 - Walking to Central may be the quickest way home.
- B Bus**
 - Bus interchanges will be relocated. Check the map for temporary terminal locations.
 - Access to Wynyard buses will be via King St only.
 - Between 2pm and 6pm, Circular Quay buses will start and end at Martin Place. From 6pm, buses will be relocated to temporary terminals in Hyde Park and bus arrangements will be changed at Wynyard.
- F Ferry**
 - Due to a harbour exclusion zone, ferries will stop running from the early afternoon. Some services will restart after the midnight fireworks, but there'll be high demand so plan ahead.
- L Light rail**
 - From 6am to 6pm, buses will replace light rail between Central and the Star.
 - From 2.30pm to 4am, extra light rail services will run between Convention and Dulwich Hill.
 - From 6pm to 6am, buses will replace light rail between Central and Convention only (not stopping at Capitol Square, Paddy's Market, and Exhibition Centre).
- Taxi**
 - Taxi ranks are located on the corner of Liverpool St and Elizabeth St in the CBD and on Lime St in King Street Wharf (this rank will not operate between 11pm and 1:30am).

Program of events on Sydney Harbour

It's not just about midnight. The Sydney New Year's Eve program keeps you entertained from sunset to the final countdown.

- 6pm & 8pm** **Air displays**
Flyovers with aerial displays by flying ace Matt Hall.
- 7.00pm** **Fire tug water display**
Port Authority of NSW fire tug blasts tonnes of water into the skies.
- 8.38pm** **Welcome to Country Ceremony**
Reflecting our respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and heritage, this ceremony honours the relationship between traditional custodians and the land. Flores are released and spectacular images on the pylons celebrate Eora country.
- 9.00pm** **9pm family fireworks**
Enjoy a dramatic eight-minute fireworks display at a family-friendly time, complete with soundtrack for children on 2DayFM and the full effect of four firework barges and the underside of the Sydney Harbour Bridge. Projections and lighting will continue throughout the evening.
- 9.15pm** **Harbour of Light Parade**
An illuminated flotilla of vessels sails through the harbour.
- Midnight** **Midnight fireworks**
At the stroke of midnight, Sydney's world-famous fireworks bring in the new year in spectacular style with a 12 minute display. Synchronised to the soundtrack on 2DayFM and the full effect of seven barges the Sydney Harbour Bridge and four sails of the Sydney Opera House. Each year the design of the fireworks brings surprises and wows millions of viewers around the world.
